The Carnegie Mellon School of Architecture invites applications from educators and practitioners to teach design studio and electives in the undergraduate, five-year accredited Bachelor of Architecture program. We seek dynamic and innovative faculty who can contribute to a curriculum that provides both the focused specializations of architectural practice, and the broader interdisciplinary connections of architectural education within a College of Fine Arts and larger research university. Applicants have the significant opportunity to contribute to an evolving design curriculum that has recently implemented a final thesis. The School particularly invites applicants with backgrounds in:

- Beginning Design
- Design and building construction innovation
- Design and history or theory
- Design and integrated practice
- Design and landscape
- Design and urban design

Appointments are expected to begin in the Fall 2008.

### **TWO TENURE-TRACK POSITIONS, Assistant or Associate Professor Rank**

In addition to teaching one design studio per semester, successful candidates will also have the complementary knowledge and expertise to teach an additional required or elective course each semester. Applicants must hold a Master of Architecture or professional degree with commensurate professional practice. In addition, applicants who envision building a tenure case on practice are expected to be licensed, and applicants who envision building a tenure case in architectural history must have a Ph.D.

### **TWO VISITING PROFESSORS (1 to 2 year appointment)**

In addition to teaching one design studio per semester, successful candidates will also have the complementary knowledge and expertise to teach an additional required or elective course each semester. Applicants must hold a Master of Architecture or professional degree with commensurate professional practice.

### **LUCIAN and RITA CASTE Assistant Professor in Architecture and Urban Design**

The Caste Chair in Architecture and Urban Design is a one to three year appointment at the level of assistant professor with responsibility for teaching architecture and urban design-based studios and electives in the Bachelor of Architecture program. The School of Architecture seeks urban designers with demonstrated design creativity and innovation who possess the vision, commitment and ability to inspire students of architecture and urban design and to advance the cause of contemporary architecture.

### **T. DAVID FITZGIBBON Visiting Professor (1 to 2 year appointment)**

The Fitzgibbon Chair provides the opportunity for an innovative practitioner with an active practice to teach one studio per semester while also participating in the intellectual life of the School.

### **APPLICATIONS:**

Review of applications will begin January 15, 2008, and will remain open until the positions are filled. Letters should include:

- (1) the specific positions for which you are applying
- (2) discussion of the studios and electives you are prepared to teach
- (3) discussion of your teaching philosophy and practices
- (4) discussion of your qualifications and goals for the specific positions

In addition, applications should include:

- (1) a complete c.v.
- (2) complete contact information (mailing address, phone numbers, email address) of three references
- (3) a brief portfolio of professional and studio accomplishments
- (4) two or more syllabi or proposals for non-studio electives
- (5) a teaching portfolio with course descriptions, assignments, course evaluations, and samples of student work, as appropriate.
